HMRC back down on arguments made by VATangles concerning the fundraising VAT exemption for Agricultural Shows / Memberships.

When the pandemic hit in 2020, Agricultural shows stopped overnight, which impacted the ability of some societies to raise funds through these events. VATangles worked with its client, Westmorland Agricultural Society, to review case law and look for an angle to pursue with HMRC to recover funds and save on output VAT.

Following a review of the case law applying to agricultural societies, our consultants noticed a point of law that they could argue with HMRC and proceeded with an appeal to the Tribunal on behalf of Westmorland.

A month before the appeal was meant to be heard, HMRC backed down and accepted the position put forward by VATangles. As a result, Westmorland benefited from a significant VAT repayment and a beneficial ruling going forward.
